

Preston River Walk Trail



A loop trail of approximately **5km** taking about **2hrs**.

This trail is well defined, has gentle gradients with a few steps. It traverses through a lush riparian river ecosystem encompassing the suspension bridge, a weir crossing and incorporates the Preston River Indigenous Walk Trail and the Waugyl Sculpture Park. As you walk along the trail tread softly and see how many different birds and animals you can see.

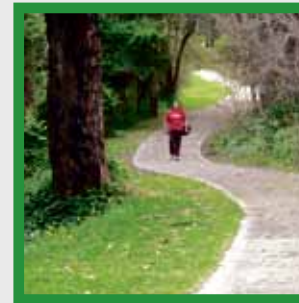


Lions Sandhills Walk Trail



A loop trail of approximately **4.7km** taking about **2hrs**.

A moderate well defined trail, with some steeper sections and uneven loose surfaces. An array of wildflowers can be seen throughout this picturesque walk. This area was last logged prior to 1962 when it became Ryall's Nature Reserve. Passing through Ryall's Nature Reserve (please observe the guidelines before entering the Nature Reserve) you will emerge to enjoy uninterrupted views of the Donnybrook rural landscapes.

Lions Forest Walk Trail



A loop trail of approximately **3.7km** taking about **90mins**.

This moderate, well defined trail has some steeper sections, with uneven loose surfaces. Commencing at the town's cemetery, this bush walk showcases some of the diverse history of the region offering extensive views, from the lookout, over the town site and across the valley of orchards and vineyards.
