Golden Valley Tree Park Walk Trail

Trail Length/Duration

Golden Valley Tree Park Walk Trail (Map 1 below) is 1.4 km long and you should allow 20 minutes each way. The trail will take you to the nearest pedestrian entry gate in Golden Valley Tree Park. If you wish to extend your walk, follow the 15 minute trail through the Park to the gazebo in the centre of the Park (Map 2 overleaf). A number of other walking trails are able to be accessed from this point.

The route is marked by yellow trail markers bearing the sign of the Waugul, the mythical Aboriginal snake. This is not a warning, but signifies that you are on the Bibbulmum Track; a walk trail which runs nearly 950 kilometres from Perth to Albany.

The trail, which is fairly flat and even, is made of compacted gravel. There are three points at which the trail crosses the road and you should **take care when crossing roads**.

The 1.4 km trail leading out to the Park is dual purpose, but paths in the Park are designed for pedestrian access only. Those travelling on bicycle should their leave their bicycle at the entry gate or cycle up Old Padbury Road to the main car park

About the Tree Park

Golden Valley Tree Park is home to a unique collection of beautiful and interesting trees from around the world, grown in a landscaped setting. Established in 1981, this 60 hectare Park now has over 5,000 trees.
