 - a. Reiterated the main hazards local police manager are Road Crash and Land Search, no recent searches however two local fatal road crashes.
 - b. Mobile phone coverage was an issue with one fatality in Brookhampton LEMC agreed to raise issue at council meeting.
 - c. Official debrief process with local agencies going well and helping support the welfare of responders

 - a. SJA Donnybrook-Balingup releasing Staying Alive in the Shire an AED project designed to make our community more resilient when responding to sudden cardiac arrest – details attached

 - a. Quiet with 1 storm incident responded to, Bunbury SES called in to support
 - b. Training progressing well with some recent changes
